Dr. Wiley earned her Ph.D. from the University of California-Berkeley and is a professor in the Department of Anthropology at Indiana University-Bloomington. Her talk will include both biological outcomes (i.e., growth) and some of the more ethnographic issues surrounding milk consumption in the U.S. and India. Her books include: *Medical Anthropology: A Biocultural Perspective* (co-authored with John S. Allen, 2012), *Re-imagining Milk* (2011), and *An Ecology of High-altitude Infancy: A Biocultural Perspective* (2004). She is currently working on a book entitled *Cultures of Milk: The Biology and Culture of Dairy Consumption in India and the United States* to be published by Harvard University Press.
